We are preparing to celebrate the Songkran festival from the 13th through the 15th of April. Much of the tasty food we will be enjoying and sharing with our students' families and our neighbors during the upcoming festival are products produced by our team and our students here on our own land.

We have an abundant supply of naturally produced rice in our store-room, and our fresh chemical-free products include: mangoes, papayas, bananas, guavas, soursops, lemons, oregano, basil, sweet basil, holy basil, coriander, chilies, corn, cucumbers, lettuce, tomatoes, Thai tomatoes, spring onions, brinjal, cabbage, pumpkins, sweet potatoes, radishes, kang kong, Chinese celery, butterfly pea, and mushrooms.

Our knowledge about agriculture in Northeast Thailand is increasing, in large part due to the locals who are happy to share their knowledge and experience. We are especially thankful to have Teacher Seth on our teaching team. Seth is a hard -working farmer who has a patient way of sharing his knowledge with anyone who is interested in learning. Recently Seth taught us how to grow straw mushrooms. We invited our neighbors in to observe as we made a video presentation documenting our mushroom project. Two weeks later our initial straw mushroom harvest was not disappointing. Currently, we are experimenting with several types of natural fertilizers to see if we can increase the harvest even more.

Please pray for our students and their families. Ask God to create strong bonds between the parents and the children during this holiday break. And pray that Harvest Learning Center will be able to fully open our on-site education program after Songkran on 18 April. Thank you for you faithfulness.
